FALL HIGHLIGHT: LEADERSHIP



Floris UMC relies on its members to provide leadership and oversight for the church and it's ministries. Here are our primary leadership committees.

Church Council

The Council provides for planning and implementing a program of nurture, outreach, witness and resources at Floris UMC. It also envisions, plans, implements and annually evaluates the ministries of the church.

Trustees

The Trustees Committee is responsible for the supervision, oversight and care of all property owned by Floris UMC, and overseas the safety initiatives of the church.

Finance

The Finance Committee provides oversight for the stewardship of financial resources throughout the calendar year.

Committee on Lay Leadership

The Lay Leadership Committee serves throughout the year to guide the Church Council on matters regarding leadership (other than employed staff) and to identify, train and support leaders in the congregation.

Staff Parish Relations Committee

The Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) is responsible for encouraging, supporting, and nurturing the pastors and staff, providing an annual evaluation of the pastors and staff, developing and approving written employee handbook policies and providing other human resource direction as needed.
